Public Interest Careers and Funding	<p>Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Benefits available to alumni who work in qualifying public interest, judicial clerkships or government jobs and earn up to \$80,000 a year • Provides assistance equal to required Income-Based Repayment (IBR) payments each year for a maximum of 10 years after graduation • Each year's LRAP loan is fully forgiven one year after it is made • Participation in LRAP for 10 years can result in a free Law School education <p>Summer Public Interest Funding</p> <p>1L students undertaking qualifying public interest or government work that first summer are guaranteed an award of \$5,000 to assist with living expenses. 2L students who obtain qualifying employment in the second summer are also guaranteed funding.</p>
