Re: STUDENT FELLOWSHIPS for 2009–10

The John M. Olin Program in Law and Economics has available several scholarships of \$5,000 each for the 2009–10 academic year. The scholarships are granted on condition that the student attends the Law and Economics Workshop and completes a substantial paper in law and economics for 4 credits.

Some of these scholarships are sponsored by the Olin Foundation and will be awarded to students who have demonstrated an interest in the area of law and economics and will be awarded without regard to financial need.

Others are sponsored by our grants from Microsoft, Pfizer and PhRMA. These will be awarded to students who have demonstrated an interest in the areas of law and economics, especially in relationship to intellectual property, network industries, antitrust, regulation, biotechnology, regulatory oversight and tort liability. The scholarships will be awarded without regard to financial need.

Students who wish to apply for one of these scholarships should provide Marjorie Holme with

- a current resume (including an address and e-mail where you can be reached during the summer),
- a statement describing your interest in the area of law and economics and outlining which courses in law and economics you have taken and which courses you plan to take during the fellowship year, and
- a statement describing your proposed paper topic.

This material should be submitted no later than June 26, 2009. The applications will be reviewed by a faculty committee which will make decisions during the summer. Students who currently have a fellowship from Olin are not eligible for another from Olin; they are, however, eligible for one of the corporate sponsored fellowships.
