<p>Public Interest Careers and Funding</p>	<p><b>Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Benefits available to alumni who work in qualifying public interest, judicial clerkships or government jobs and earn up to \$80,000 a year</li> <li>• Provides assistance equal to required Income-Based Repayment (IBR) payments each year for a maximum of 10 years after graduation</li> <li>• Each year’s LRAP loan is fully forgiven the year after it is made</li> <li>• Participation in LRAP for 10 years can potentially result in having all of your Law School eligible federal loans forgiven</li> </ul> <p><b>Summer Public Interest Funding</b></p> <p>Both 1L and 2L students who work in eligible summer nonprofit or government law positions are guaranteed an award of \$5,000.</p>
